Weekly Round-Up for Parents

Below is our weekly roundup for parents. I hope you are managing to stay safe and well and I would like to express our heartfelt appreciation for the unwavering support we have received through your emails and messages of encouragement and thanks. They really are keeping us going and make our work worthwhile, knowing that it is having a positive impact on our students and families. We also continue to welcome your feedback on improvements that may be needed too, so please continue to contact us.

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Remote Learning

We have had another really successful week of remote learning. Last week, we offered more live teaching and aim to gradually increase this number in the coming weeks. Please can we ask that you ensure your son / daughter is logging on with plenty of time to join in, so that they don't miss the start of the lesson or arrive flustered. We record all of our live lessons, so if they have found an aspect of the lesson problematic, they can pause and go back over the content. Equally, if they are unable to log in at the time the lesson is live, they can do it later in the day. We have asked students to ensure all work is uploaded and submitted on the day of the lesson, and this is to give them some flexibility within their day and to ensure they can get their 'present' mark by submitting the work. Rewards

We are very conscious that it is hard for students to remain focussed and positive when they are away from their teachers and friends, so we are keen to do what we can to recognise their efforts and keep them motivated. In the last couple of weeks we have seen the outstanding effort that has gone into online learning from our students and in recognition of their continued efforts, we will be launching a lockdown rewards scheme. We have asked subjects teachers to post home little cards every week that acknowledge the effort students are putting into their work.

We will also be introducing 'Lockdown Legends'. Teachers have been asked to nominate students who are really going above and beyond at home. We'd love you to send in images of great work or your son / daughter engaging with remote learning activities so that we can share these on our social media platforms and with the wider school community. 20.20.20 Rule – Supporting Students with Screen Time

One of our students shared with Mrs Ward that the opticians have advised them of the 20 20 20 rule, which is useful for anyone using a computer. Every 20 minutes, you must look at something 20 feet away for 20 seconds to rest your eyes. This can help prevent tiredness and headaches from prolonged screen focus. We also recommend, getting up and taking time away from the screen in between each lesson and where possible, taking some time to get some fresh air.

Isca: A Reading School - Y7 and Y8 Only

During this challenging time, the English Team at Isca know the joy and pure escapism a great book can bring to people. We are really keen that our students keep on enjoying amazing stories and taking part in the Accelerated Reader book quizzes to track their reading journey. Students are being given the opportunity to spend one of their English lessons reading each week. This maybe a book of their own or by watching the YouTube videos of their Teachers reading some brilliant books. Amongst the choices available to our students are *Wonder* which follows August, a young ten-year-old boy born with an incredible facial abnormality. It emphasises the importance of compassion for those who are less fortunate and the innate humanity we share despite our differences. There is also Patrick Ness' *A Monster Calls*, an emotional read about love, loss and the power of stories, accompanied by beautiful illustrations.
