

## Post-16 – Next Steps: Information for Students, Parents and Carers

At this point in the academic year, Y11 students should have either submitted an application to their chosen post 16 destination or be in the process of making their final decision before applying.

If your child still needs to apply, please see the information below which should help them with their course choice and how to apply. Please also see the information regarding careers advice available to them.

### Careers Advice

Many students in Y11 have already met with Maria Masters (a qualified Independent Careers Adviser) at Isca for a 1:1 interview.

Careers Guidance Interviews will be resuming from Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> January. Maria will be phoning students to discuss their career ideas and post 16 plans. She will then email a detailed action plan and resources as a follow up.

### Exeter College (based at different sites in and around Exeter city centre)

Courses are available as follows:

**Full time Vocational BTEC Diplomas (Levels 1, 2 and 3).** See page 16 of course guide for details of all subjects available.

These are practical, hands on courses, assessed mostly by coursework with less emphasis on exams. A student can progress from L1 to L2 and from L2 to L3. A good pass at L3 will allow for progression to university/undergraduate study. Just ONE of these courses can be studied (no combinations).

- Level 1 courses require grade 2 in English and Maths, plus 2 other GCSEs (4 in total).
- Level 2 courses require grade 3 in English and Maths, plus 2 other GCSEs (4 in total).
- Level 3 course require grade 4 in English and Maths, plus 3 other GCSEs (5 in total).

**A levels and BTEC Certificates (Level 3)** See pages 11 and 12 of the course guide for details of subjects available.

This route is for students who enjoy academic study. Assessment is mostly by examinations at the end of the 2 year course.

Three subjects must be studied in combination (either 3 A levels or 2 A levels plus one BTEC Certificate). Entry requirements are 8 GCSEs all at grade 4 or higher (see individual subject entry requirements). An Extend option must also be chosen (studied for one hour a week in the first year only). **T Levels (Level 2 and Level 3)** See page 15 for details.

These are new vocational qualifications involving 80% full time study, plus 20% (315) hours on a specific work placement. Grade 3 or 4 in English and Maths is required plus additional GCSEs depending on the level and subject studied.

**International Baccalaureate (Level 3)** See pages 127 and 128 for details.

Students study 6 academic subjects, 3 at Standard Level and 3 at Higher Level. Entry requirement is at least 8 GCSE's at a minimum of grade 6 or above.

**Apprenticeships.** See pages 17 and 18 for full details and page 19 for industry sectors available.

#### **How to Apply To Exeter College**

To submit an application to Exeter College, visit: <https://apply.exe-coll.ac.uk/> and complete the following steps:

- Follow the 'Register' link. On this link you will be asked to submit your email address and to create a password.
  - Give your personal email address (not your Isca email) as this address will be used once you have left Isca.
  - The password must have at least 8 characters, one of which can't be a letter or a number (so include !,?/ for example). YOU MUST REMEMBER THIS PASSWORD, SO KEEP IT SAFE. IT IS THE ONLY WAY YOU WILL BE ABLE TO ACCESS YOUR APPLICATION AND ACCOUNT AT ANY TIME IN THE FUTURE.
- Once you have registered, you will immediately receive an email from Exeter College. Open this email and click on the link to activate your account. Then return to the first page (<https://apply.exe-coll.ac.uk/>) and continue as an existing applicant. Your username is your email address and the password is the one you created to register for your account.
