Year 11 Centre Assessed Grades

As promised, we are now in a position to confirm the assessment plan for our Year 11 students which will enable us to gather further evidence to support the evaluation of their learning in each course. The work that students have completed throughout their course counts and the assessments simply add to their portfolio of evidence. It is incredibly important that students continue to attend each day, work hard in school and at home and use the feedback from their teachers so that they feel prepared for the upcoming assessments. The assessment calendar will be sent via GroupCall on Monday to the parents of Year 11 students as well as being given to the students in school.

Assessment Week

Next week, students will be sitting assessments in the vast majority of their subjects. We know that students will have returned to school having had a mixed experience during lockdown. Therefore the purpose of the assessments is to ascertain where students are in their learning, so that we can amend our curriculum planning accordingly for the summer term. We do not want students to worry about assessment week, but instead to give their best in each and every assessment. To that end, we have asked teachers to direct students to specific areas of revision for their homework during assessment week and have removed homework sanctions. Staff will be available each night to supervise and support private study, if students wish to attend.

Home testing

Additional home testing kits will be sent home on Wednesday 31st March with those students who have consent and were tested in school over the previous weeks. Students will need to complete the tests during the Easter break as usual and report the results to both the NHS and the [school here](#).

Should your child test positive for Covid please record the result as above and email the school on covid@iscaexeter.co.uk to inform us as soon as possible. A reminder that positive test results from a home test **will require a confirmatory PCR test** to be completed. This is because the home tests are not conducted in a controlled environment.
