Dear Parents,

Our year 11 students have been working extremely hard in preparation for their assessments which will contribute to their centre assessed grades. Their dedication, focus and maturity will, I am sure, support them in reaching their goals and achieving the qualifications that they deserve.

As you know, we are required to submit centre assessed grades to the examination boards by **Friday 18th June**. Before that, we will be working with our students to select the evidence that most accurately reflects their attainment in each subject. Our centre policy, which details more specifically how we will determine the centre assessed grades can be found on the [Exam page](#) of our website. The GCSE and vocational qualification results will then be published on **Thursday 12th August**.

Please see below our outline plan for Year 11 which will commence after May half term on Monday 7th June for 3 weeks. As mentioned in last week's letter, the last legal day students are required to attend school is Friday 25th June. We have made good use of this time to build in some transition bridging activities to help prepare those going on to further education, plus; team-building; mental health and well-being sessions, and; 1:1 appointments to support 'next steps'. More specific details of the sessions and individualised timetables will be issued to students before the end of this half term. The dress code after May half term for our students in Year 11 will be College attire (smart casual) and not school uniform. Students will be required to continue to arrive at school for their sessions with a face covering.

The provisional date for our Year 11 Celebration Evening is Thursday the 8th July. However we are still unable to confirm if this will go ahead, given the uncertainty surrounding the national easing of restrictions. Therefore we strongly advise that no financial commitments are made until confirmed details are released. We recognise that you will want to plan ahead, but I am sure you can appreciate that given the continued uncertainty around organising gatherings, we cannot confirm details at this time. However, we will continue to monitor the situation and update you as soon as we possibly can.
