
Sports-Mad at Isca

Riddler in Residence! Our English Team are thrilled to be working in partnership with Exeter Cathedral on their first ever Riddler in Residence project. A poet, Chris White, has been recruited to work with one of our Year 7 classes to co-create a poetic response (to include performances) linking the 10th century poems and riddles of The Exeter Book with contemporary verse.

Apprenticeship Expo: Year 10 students taking part in *National Apprenticeship Week* earlier this month should be very proud of themselves having truly impressed employers with their mature attitudes and level of questioning. A few students even took it upon themselves to organise work experience placements, with one student making a positive impression with GWR which bodes well for his future apprenticeship application.

Inspiring Girls: Five students are lucky enough to have been chosen to participate in the Inspiring Girls programme this term. Conceived by Sarah Abrahams, Senior Lead at M&S Bank and local resident, the programme has been taking place in most of our schools across the city and surrounding areas, following a successful pilot last year. With a focus on raising aspirations, the girls receive mentoring sessions from Exeter-based business women, and this includes an Articulatory Workshop designed to raise their confidence.

CoachBright: We also have more than 40 students in Years 9 and 10 participating in the CoachBright Mentoring programme, as part of the National Tutoring Programme. Students attended two launch events at Exeter University earlier this week, and will commence mentoring sessions with students from Exeter University after the half term break. The aim of this programme is to improve skills and understanding in Maths, English and Science, as well as taking a closer look at higher education and future career paths, as well as building confidence.

Canteen: Online Payments Update
